About the Institute

The Indian Law Institute (ILI) was founded in 1956 primarily with the objective of promoting and conducting legal research. It was established as a result of the efforts of the leading jurists of India for over a number of years. There were many important reasons impelling the establishment of a national legal research centre. First, there was a need for reinvigorating legal research as law, legal research and legal education had been neglected areas in India, both before and after the independence. Second, there was a need for a sustained institutionalized research encompassing projects requiring field studies and group thinking. Third, it was necessary to bring together different branches of the legal profession, namely, judges, lawyers and law teachers, with a view to develop an integrated approach to law in society.

The Institute is an autonomous body registered under the Societies Registration Act, 1860. The autonomous character of the Institute and its independence ensure the requisite academic freedom to carry out its objectives and meaningful research. The Indian Law Institute was granted Deemed University status in 2004 vide Government of India, Ministry of Human Resource Development Notification No.F.9- 9/2001-U.3 dated 29.10.2004. Institute has been accredited with 'A' Grade (CGPA 3.35 out of 4.00) by NAAC.



Aims & Objectives of the Institute

The prime objective of ILI is to cultivate and promote the science of law and to contribute substantially in reforming the administration of justice, so as to meet the socio-economic aspirations and needs of the people through law and its instrumentalities. The Institute has achieved the place of a premier center of national & international legal research and studies, in which lawyers from all branches of the profession as well as judges, government officials and academicians have been participating.

Broad Objectives of the Institute

- ❖ to cultivate the science of law, and to promote advanced studies and research in law and its administration;
- ❖ to promote the reform of administration of justice and of law and its health/development suitable to the social, economic and other needs of the people;
- ❖ to promote the clarification, simplification and systematization of law;
- ❖ to encourage and conduct investigations in legal and allied fields;
- ❖ to promote the diffusion of the knowledge of law and its administration and principles on which they are based;
- ❖ to promote the improvement of legal education, and to impart instruction in law and allied fields;
- ❖ to publish studies, treatises, books, periodicals, reports and other literature relating to law and allied fields;
- ❖ to undertake documentation of important legal and allied materials;
- ❖ to institute and maintain libraries;
- ❖ to cooperate with other societies, institutions and organizations, national and international, in the pursuit of all or any of the above objects;
- ❖ to constitute or cause to be constituted regional offices at convenient centers in India to promote the activities of the Institute.

The Objective of the Energy Usage and Environment Policy

- ❖ To provide holistic education that has constructive impact on the environment.
