Wednesday Seminar :

Wednesday Seminar/Panel discussions is one of the unique components of the LL.M. Course Curriculum. Important Judgments rendered by the High Courts and the Supreme Court, new legislative proposal, recommendations of the Law Commission of India are mainly discussed by the students and the members of the faculty. It enhances critical thinking about the contemporary legal issues and allows students to express their views on the legal issues. ILI has organized number of national and international conferences by inviting legal scholars, Hon'ble judges of Supreme Court of India and High Courts.

Institutional Repository/Digital Collection of Institute's Library

The ILI has been at the forefront of legal research and publications in India. It has published numerous books, journals, and research papers in various areas of law, including Constitutional Law, International Law and Intellectual Property Law. The Institute is dedicated to developing a critical legal pedagogy and the students are offered a range of elective courses within their field of specialization and concerted efforts are made to encourage interdisciplinary orientation. The Institute has one of the biggest law libraries in Asia and it attracts scholars from all over the world for legal research. The University Grants Commission has recognized the ILI library as a

place for legal research leading to doctorate degree in law and political science. The Institute is equipped with learning facilitators and gadgets.

The Institute has digitized collection of rare documents, ILI publications, various commission and committee reports, federal court reports, Indian Law reports etc. The access to ILI digital library is available in public domain and can be accessed free of cost. The digital wing of the library i.e. Legal Information Resource Centre (LIRC) has almost all legal databases including SCC Online, Manupatra, The Laws, Lexis India, West Law India, JSTOR, Hein Online, Taxmann & EPW Online etc., and Ouriginal and Turnitin software to check plagiarism and maintain the quality of research. For optimum retrieval of information through various e-Resources, a federated search engine has been subscribed to facilitate single point search to maximum results.
